TMTA Piano Solo Contest on January 16 TMTA World of Music Test on February 22 DMTA Recital Series Concert on February 23 DMTA teachers who enter students in any DMTA sponsored adjudicated events are required to monitor. We are required to notify the chairman of the event if we are unable to monitor for any reason. Next, we are expected to contact the Vice-President to find the name of a DMTA teacher who has agreed to serve as a monitor. (The recommended amount to pay a substitute is \$75 per event.) A teacher who needs a monitor also is allowed to ask another DMTA teacher who is not on the list to substitute. The member who needs a substitute must notify the chairman of the event of this change at least two weeks prior to the event. If a member fails to monitor or to provide a substitute, he will be fined \$100 and all of his students will be suspended from participating in the event the following year. Code of Ethics

The principles and aspirations found in the Code of Ethics are not conditions of membership, but are goals and ideals that DMTA members should strive to make an essential part of their professional commitment to students, to colleagues and to society.

Commitment to Students

- The teacher shall interact with students and families in a professional manner.
- The teacher shall respect the personal integrity and privacy of students unless the law requires disclosure.
 - The teacher shall clearly communicate the expectations of the studio.
- The teacher shall encourage, quide and develop the musical potential of each student.
- The teacher shall treat each student with dignity and respect, without discrimination of any kind.
- The teacher shall respect the student's right to obtain instruction from the teacher of his choice.

Commitment to Colleagues

- The teacher shall maintain a professional attitude and shall act with integrity regarding colleagues in the profession.
- The teacher shall respect the reputation of colleagues and shall refrain from making false or malicious statements about colleagues.
- The teacher shall refrain from disclosing sensitive information about colleagues obtained in the course of professional service unless disclosure serves a compelling professional purpose or is required by law.
- The teacher shall participate in the student's change of teachers with as much communication as possible between parties, while being sensitive to the privacy rights of the students and families.

Commitment to Society

- The teacher shall maintain the highest standard of professional conduct and personal integrity.
 - The teacher shall accurately represent her professional qualifications.
 - The teacher shall strive for continued growth in professional competencies.
 - The teacher is encouraged to be a resource in the community.

PLEASE UPDATE YOUR STUDENTS' SCHOOL GRADE LEVEL PRIOR TO REGISTERING.


Attendance Policy: All teachers must have attended 3 DMTA meetings in the 2023-2024 school year to participate.
